I always thank people when they contribute, and they usually say "No. Thank you." On one occasion the reply was "No. Thank you for volunteering your time to do this for the Shriners.

I have had people leave the store only to promptly return for the sole purpose of putting funds into the Red Can.

I have seen customers come into the store, deposit funds in the Red Can,

and leave with groceries costing less than the amount they donated.

I often tell people that "Nobody asks me what the Shriners do," and they always reply "Every body knows what the Shriners do."

People you would not expect to contribute such as employees from the stores, including the carriage boys have contributed.

Canning is easy. We always work inside, you don't have to beg, or ask for a donation, or block their exit. Just stand, or sit there wearing your Fez, Unit Jacket or some symbol indicating you're a Shriner, along with a smile, and more people than not will donate to the cause. As a matter of fact at the end of a shift upon emptying the receipts into a bag for safe keeping I have had people reach over, and put funds into the bag.
